He first moved to Upstate South Carolina to attend Bob Jones University where he obtained his bachelor's degree. After college, Dr. Apple obtained his medical degree from the University of South Carolina in Columbia, SC. After completing an internal medicine internship at Greenville Memorial Hospital, Dr. Apple completed his ophthalmology training at the University of Minnesota. He then moved back to his home state of Michigan to complete a two year vitreoretinal surgery fellowship at Kresge Eye Institute in Detroit, MI, where he obtained extensive experience in diagnosis and management of complex and advanced vitreoretinal diseases.

The lecture team of **Drs. They have lectured nationally and internationally on ocular disease and pharmacology at over 1,000 continuing medical education meetings. Drs. Melton and Thomas have authored or co-authored over 100 papers on optometry and are the co-authors of the popular annual "Clinical Guide to Ophthalmic Drugs" for *Review of Optometry*. They have has acted as investigators in more than 50 clinical research trials. Both are certified as a Diplomate, American Board of Optometry. They are full-time clinicians delivering primary and secondary eye care.

Dr. Sean Smolenyak: a native of Great Falls, Virginia. He completed his undergraduate degree at the University of Virginia, and received his Doctor of Optometry from the Pennsylvania College of Optometry in 2001. Since then Dr. Smolenyak has specialized in the medical management of eye diseases. His interests include dry eye disease, conjunctivitis, uveitis, ocular emergencies, macular degeneration and glaucoma. He also works closely with local physicians to help manage diabetic patients. He also has extensive experience in the postoperative management of cataract surgery. Dr. Smolenyak is an active member of the American Optometric Association and the North Carolina State Optometric Society.
